



Create a flower

You will need:

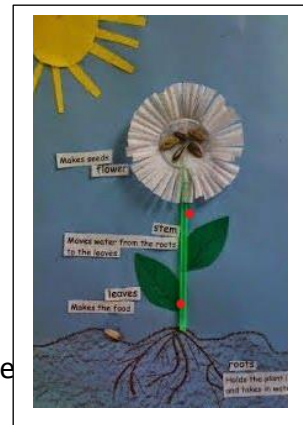
- 1 pipe cleaner (for stem)
- Some yarn (for roots)
- Crayons or markers (soil, cloud, rain, sun)
- Construction paper (for leaves)
- Cupcake holder (for flower)
- Sunflower seeds (for seeds)
- White construction paper
- Scissors
- Glue
- Tape

Before you start:

- Read the paper about parts of a flower and what they do

Make your flower:

- Fold the pipe cleaner in half, then twist it and glue it to the paper (for the stem)
- Cut out some leaves and glue them onto the stem
- Cut some short pieces of yarn (roots) and glue or tape them to the bottom of the
- Flatten the cupcake holder and cut 1 inch slits around the side to make petals
- Tape or glue the cupcake holder (flower) to the top of the stem
- Place a small puddle of glue in the center of the cupcake holder and sprinkle in the sunflower seeds
- Above the flower, draw a cloud with raindrops, and a sun
- Draw a line just above the roots to show where the soil is
- Cut out the labels and tape or glue them to your picture to show the parts of a flower and what they do

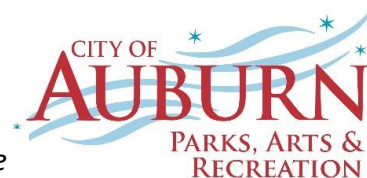

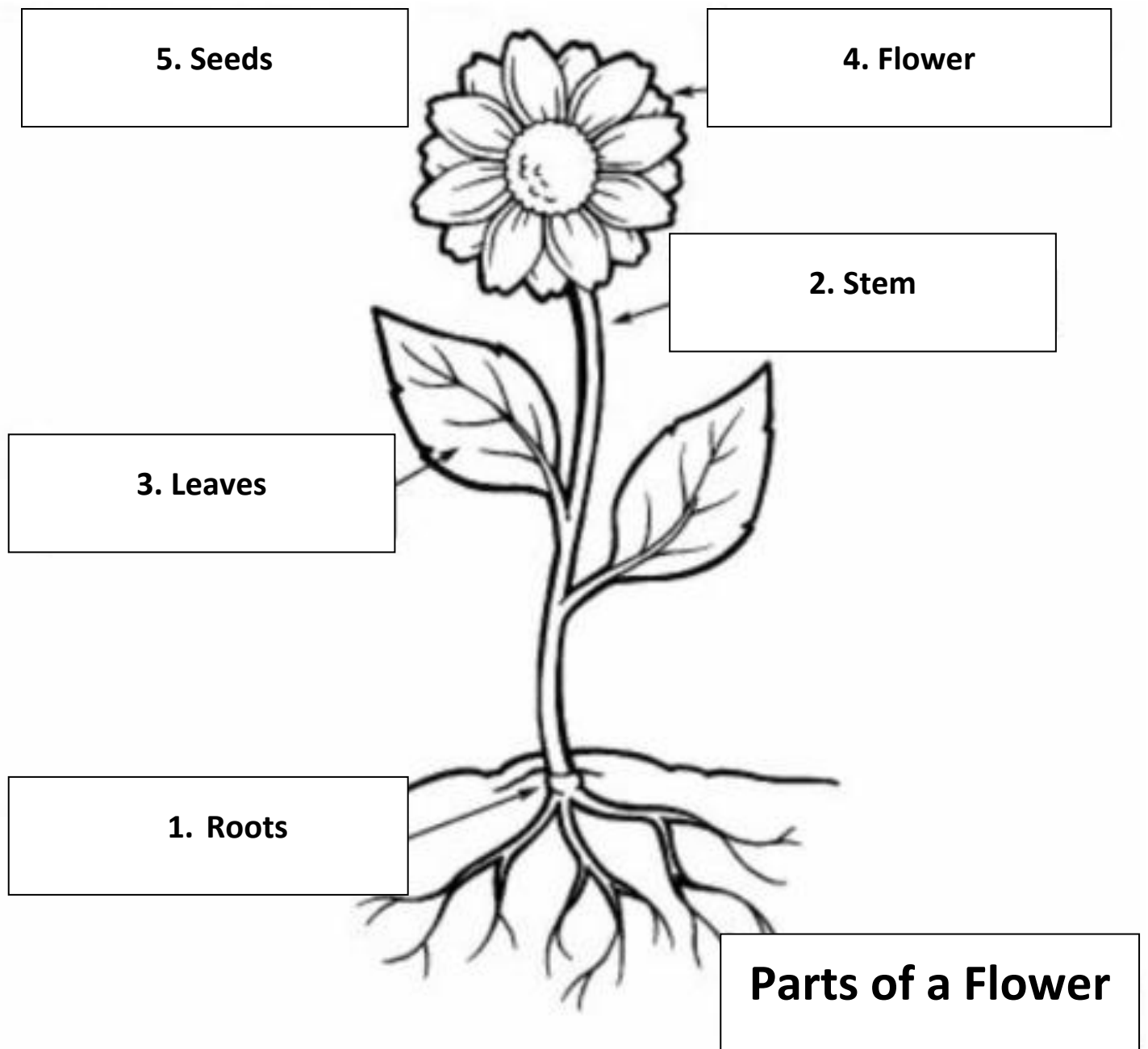

1. The roots suck in water and nutrients to feed the plant
2. The stem moves water and nutrients up to the leaves and the flower
3. The leaves take energy from the sunlight to make food for the plant
4. The flower makes new seeds
5. Seeds make new plants
